## AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE BEDFORDSHIRE AND HERTFORDSHIRE HISTORIC CHURCHES TRUST

#### The Trust aims to:

- assist those responsible for the care of places used for public worship in the two counties which belong to a Christian religious body;
- make funds available for the restoration, maintenance, preservation, repair and reconstruction of churches and chapels.

#### Accordingly, it seeks to:

- maintain a large, supportive membership whose annual committed income from subscriptions and donations will give a firm basis upon which to conduct its affairs;
- foster an informed appreciation of the history, architecture and beauty of the churches and chapels in the two counties and so provide a way for the wider community to help to maintain that irreplaceable heritage;
- raise substantial amounts of money, primarily through the annual Sponsored Bike'n Hike, an event promoted by The National Churches Trust and supported by other County Trusts;
- co-operate with other bodies making funds available for the purposes set out above.

#### THE CHAIRMAN'S REPORT, 2022-2023



Much of the Trust's activity over recently has been focused on administrative changes consequent upon its registration with the Charity Commission as a Charitable Incorporated Organization whose only voting members are its charity trustees. The Commission has approved our new Constitution. This means that most of our work will continue as before, but the Trust, the name of which remains unchanged, is now a legal entity in itself and so able to hold investments in its own name instead of having to entrust them to individual named trustees. This means that we shall be able to invest more widely to achieve an increased income. This will be of considerable importance when we relaunch the Jubilee Endowment Appeal, which we had to suspend at the start of the pandemic. The re-registration requires us to close our existing bank accounts and open new ones, and we had hoped to have achieved this by now, but, in common with many other Trusts, we have experienced long and confusing delays in dealing with the banks. Until we have the new

accounts in operation, and can give details to potential donors, we cannot issue new stationery and publicity materials, which are necessary if the Trust is to be better known in our two counties.

Apart from these frustrations 'normal service' has been resumed after the pandemic. Our church coach tours are up and running again, and we hope to welcome increasing numbers of supporters and friends to learn more about some of the important church buildings scattered around our townscapes and countryside. Our last Annual Meeting resumed its traditional pattern, linking a business meeting with a couple of church visits and an excellent tea. The pandemic made us acutely aware of the importance of the social dimension of our activities.

The primary function of the Trust is to provide grants to assist in the maintenance, repair and restoration of churches in Bedfordshire and Hertfordshire and that part of Barnet in the Diocese of St Albans, and, in the past year we have maintained the level of grants awarded (approximately £150,000 to 22 churches), as a result of the splendid result of the previous year's Bike 'n Hike Appeal and our continuing partnership with the Wixamtree Trust; we are deeply grateful to all who helped to make this possible. It was unfortunate that our latest Bike 'n Hike was overshadowed by the death, just two days beforehand, of Her Majesty the Queen. The total raised was down by about one-tenth, being a little short of £91,500. This means that we will have to be a little less generous in the coming year. But the day brought us an excellent result, and we are grateful to all who participated and to our own team of hard-working Organizers.


The year has seen the death of a number of our valued supporters, the most notable being Sir Samuel Whitbread, a former Lord-Lieutenant of Bedfordshire, who was the inspiration behind our partnership with the Wixamtree Trust which significantly augments the help we are able to give to churches in Bedfordshire. Another link with the past was severed by the death of Anthea Lepper, widow of one of the founders of the Trust. We are grateful for all they contributed to the Trust over the years.

We were delighted to "sign up" our new Treasurer, Trevor Groom, in September, and he is now engaged in reviewing the structure of our finances to make them simpler and more transparent. All the Trustees join me in expressing our thanks to Madeline Russell for adding the burden of Acting Treasurer to her very considerable role as Bike 'n Hike Organizer for some 18 months.



We do not want it to remain, as it has been called, "the best kept secret in Bedfordshire and Hertfordshire".




St. John the Baptist, Cockayne Hatley: Parapet repairs




St. Andrew Much, Hadham: Henry Moore carvings

#### GRANTS SECRETARY'S REPORT



With the pandemic well behind us now, all is running entirely as normal.

In recognising the invaluable work undertaken by our Area Representatives I must report the retirement of Bob Hart. Bob has been a greatly valued member of the team for as long as I can remember and from whom I have had unwavering support. I am sure we all wish him well. John Creasey has provided immediate cover for Bedford for which I am most grateful.

The number of awards granted during the year has risen slightly, thirteen in Bedfordshire and nine in Hertfordshire. Whilst the majority of the work is going forward there have been a few situations where projects have not been able to start as originally planned. The Trust is able to accommodate these variations. Business continues to be brisk with currently 29 applications in play.

Our partnership with the Wixamtree Trust continues well and we were again able to deploy our allocation from them. Their annual meeting, which the Chairman and I attended, was at last in-person. This arrangement is an initiative originally proposed by Sir Samuel Whitbread and serves as a fitting memorial to his support.

The Roof Alarm programme in partnership with Allchurches Trust (now Benefact Trust) ceased at the end of June 2022. The installation of an approved alarm guarantees 100% cover in the event of lead theft. Without Allchurches' help and financial support a great many of our churches would still be at risk.

Once again, thank you to all our Area Representatives and I want to recognise and thank the many churchwardens and others who put so much time and effort into looking after our churches and chapels

#### THE BIKE 'N HIKE:



As reported in Trust News, the 2022 Bike 'n Hike was overshadowed by the death of Her Majesty The Queen. It was also at the height of concerns about rising prices because of the Ukraine war and energy shortages. It is therefore to everyone's credit that the event still raised £91,040. Thank you to all those who took part in any way and to their sponsors.

Particular thanks to gold certificate winners, for raising more than £2,000: All Saints, Southill; St. Mary, Northchurch and All Saints, Willian. Seventeen churches gained silver certificates for over £1,000 and 46 churches, bronze for over £500.

Half of the sponsorship money – over \$39,000 – was returned to churches, whilst the other half plus gift aid of some \$13,000 is being used for grants to churches for fabric repair. This means that, together with the \$151,500 given in grants, the Trust channelled \$190,500 to churches and chapels during the year.

Last year, we reported the £6,226 which had been received by Barclays Bank but not processed. Through the Financial Ombudsman, we received £500 in compensation from Barclays but our Trust treasurer, Trevor Groom, had to ask donors for replacement cheques, helped by a 'mea culpa' letter from Barclays. I am delighted that most of the cheques have been replaced and with the £500 from Barclays, the Trust is not out of pocket. Thank you to Trevor and thank you again to our Bike 'n Hike treasurer, Richard North, for the detailed records he keeps and which underpinned the success of the whole process.

Overall, the Bike 'n Hike relies on a hard-working team of people. Kelvin White as Documents Manager has the mammoth task of getting documents updated, printed and distributed to Area Organisers. Nicholas Tufton as Secretary to the group, keeps us on track. Key to the success of the event are our Area Organisers (listed elsewhere in the Report) and their contacts in churches and chapels in their areas. It was great to welcome Henrietta Buxton, Royston Jones and Ron Sambridge to the team for 2022.

Sadly, we have lost two Area Organisers since the event last year. Both Linda Singleton and Roger Kendrick passed away in the spring – may they rest in peace.

After many years as AO for Watford, Sue Oxlade has retired to York and her place has been taken by Barry Wenham, whom we welcome to the team for 2023.

We still have some vacancies where team members are doubling up and looking after two areas. What is involved is explained on the Trust's website and if you would like to help, please contact me through bikenhike@bedshertshct.org.uk.

The Trust remains ever grateful to all who have helped to organise or have taken part in the Bike 'n Hike over more than thirty years.

#### CORPORATE MEMBERS OF THE TRUST

The Trust places much importance on the growth in the number of corporate members. For a few years now it has been a condition of grant that applicant churches be members. We also strongly appreciate the membership and commitment of non-applicant churches.

The number of Corporate Members has increased from 259 to 268, including a number of Non-conformist churches. However some churches appear to have let their membership lapse: please contact Jim May, if you wish to be reinstated. There are 337 Personal Members: last year there were 348. It is clear that individual and family membership numbers are falling. It would be good if existing members could encourage their friends to join.

There are over 600 churches and chapels in our two counties, so we have a long way to go. It would be very pleasing if all churches which are not Corporate Members were to become so – for a modest subscription of \$50 p.a. If your church or chapel is not a member, please encourage those responsible to apply to Jim May, who has responsibility for Membership and the database. If you believe it should have been included on the list, please notify him directly.
